School Year 2025-2026 MAPCS High School Credit Recovery Policy

The goal of Credit Recovery is to reengage students who were unsuccessful at passing the initial course. Differentiation will be the focus to prevent disengagement and further failure. A student is eligible to enroll in Credit Recovery after he or she fails a course. Students may complete Credit Recovery by completing one of the following:

- 1. Traditional Classroom Learning/ Blended Learning where he or she will be scheduled into a class with a teacher who will review and assess content using one or a combination of projects, daily assignments, and/or online coursework.
- 2. Edgenuity where a student will complete and master content through the online platform at his or her own pace. The class will be customized by a teacher and monitored by a teacher or Academic Counselor. Once a student completes at least 60% of the content, passes a cumulative exam with at least 60% accuracy, and has an overall grade of at least 60%, he or she will be awarded the credit and the overall grade earned.

Credit Recovery may be completed without the obligation of attendance because a student may work at his or her own pace and be assessed according to his or her academic needs.
